Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-18 educational progress for Seminole Academy. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2017-18 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

* Note TSI and ATS definitions were changed for the 2018-19 school year per federal requirements. The new definitions are:

TSI – The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.

ATS – The school has met the criteria for TSI identification and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

Our school was not identified in any of these groups.

Our combined data indicates Seminole students were more proficient in English Language Arts than in Math. The Attendance report indicates some improvement in attendance of our students, but we are below the State of Michigan Average and we will need to continue to work at improving attendance. To continue to improve proficiency on our State Assessments we will continue with our Professional Learning Communities for our Educators and continue to provide incentives for our students to improve attendance.

State law requires additional information. School attendance boundaries are set by the Board of Education. All students living within the Mount Clemens Community Schools in grades Kindergarten through fifth grade attend Seminole Academy. Students living outside the Mount Clemens Community school District must select the "School of Choice" option to attend Seminole Academy. We are in the fifth year of our School Improvement Plan designed to target clear goals in both Mathematics and English Language Arts for students to continue to increase achievement. Seminole Academy houses a center-based program for PI/OHI students who fall within a certain catchment zone of Macomb County. Seminole Academy uses the Michigan Standards for ELA and Mathematics. We have begun using the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) for Science instruction, and we continue to use Michigan Grade Level Content Expectations for Social Studies instruction. Additional Curriculum questions can be obtained by contacting either the Principal or the District Curriculum Director, Elizabeth Jensen. Seminole Academy had 320 families attend Parent-Teacher Conferences in the fall, for an overall percentage of 57% of our families. Seminole Academy uses the NWEA assessment three times a year to assess reading and math. Below are the results of the Winter assessment over the last two years. NWEA is a nationally normed assessment.
