

English 12 Literature Syllabus

Course Description

In this class, we will focus on English and European literature. Using the readings, we will explore the role of the individual in shaping history. To this end, the students will work on a variety of projects that will help them fix their place in the world and give them the tools needed to tackle the future.

Objectives

Students will study the short story, novel, non-fiction, drama and poetry. There will be a concentration on the development of written and oral communication skills. Activities will include class discussions, essays, creative writing, and spoken word presentations.

In addition to the above, there will be supplemental readings, including non-fiction and poetry. Students will also be expected to read books for outside reading projects. Although the students will select these books themselves, the instructor must approve them.
