- Typed font must be size 12 using Times New Roman, Calibri, or Arial, or essays may be handwritten. If handwritten, please use legible print (no cursive).
- You may use double or single spacing for your line choice.
- If referencing others' quotes, ideas, or work, citations must be properly used. Please choose MLA or APA standards and stay consistent.
- A separate reference or bibliography page may be attached to the essay if needed.
- The applicant must discuss one of the two prompt options provided below.
- Provide your name, grade, and prompt number in the top, right hand corner of your essay.

Prompt #1:

Imagine a person awarded you a cash prize that you will consistently receive every two weeks, which will last for the rest of your life. This would cover all financial aspects of your life and is enough for you to live comfortably and luxuriously. Working for your own financial benefit would be irrelevant. Without the need or want of money for personal gain, what would you do with all your free time and why?

Thought-provoking questions to help you write (you do not need to answer these): What are your passions? Would you still work, further your education, go on endless vacations, help others?

Prompt #2:

The Everybody Eats Scholarship aims to help address many different social justice issues that affect the Mount Clemens Public School system and the greater community members that make it up. I think providing financial support for young adults to invest in themselves and their passions has powerful potential. It elevates their likelihood to become successful individuals and positively impact the future community.

What is a social justice issue or topic that you are passionate about and why? Do you have any ideas, plans, or history in combating these issues?

Thought-provoking questions to help you write (you do not need to answer these): What is social justice to you? Do you have any personal or famous role models? What would a fair and just world look like to you? Is there anything we can do to fix existing problems? Why should we fight for our rights and for change? What types of oppression affect you or others you care about? What can we do right now, as average people, to help your cause?
